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


Meet Anil, a Bible student on the left. Dr. S the theology professor in middle, and Anand, a booklover at right.

We know Dr. S that you are very tolerant of questions and that is why we wish to ask some very tough questions about Trinity today!




Trinity? That's a good topic to awaken even the sleeping. Fire your questions, provided you are willing to accept some questions from me too!

Is it right to use a word not found in the Bible?




Look at the following words:

Do you find them in the Bible?




Dr. S, the examples you gave are only "Christian" words not found in the Bible. But Trinity is a theological word not found in the Bible!



Do you find theological words like Eternal Security, Millennium, Calvinism, Canon, etc. in the Bible?




Then WHY this prejudice against the word Trinity? Should we not be fair everywhere?



But Dr. S, how can 1+1+1 be equal to 1. It is not logical because the sum ought to be 3!




Tell me. Is God a person or a number?




The definition does not say that God is one person. It says that God is one! Is there a difference?



There is a widely accepted saying that whether we are Hindus, Sikhs, Muslims or Christians, we are ONE.

NOBODY disputes this statement.



It does not mean that all Indians are ONE person. Rather, it means that there is a UNIQUE oneness among Indians so that we can say Indians are ONE.


They are ONE, about husband and wife. They are ONE about a determined team. They were ONE about military teams. I can list MANY other unique plural-one's that are there in our common vocabulary.




So, you know that ONE does not always means one person. It can have unique meanings depending upon usage.



Now you can appreciate the truth better that we see from the Bible that there are three eternal and coequal persons, but one God. It is a DIVINE oneness.



Someone told me the other day that God is only ONE person who appeared in three different forms. What do you say?

I am all ears Dr. S

Of all the possible verses, let me choose three representative ones. Matthew 3:17, Matthew 12:18, and 2 Peter 1:17. For convenience let me quote them:



And lo a voice from heaven, saying, This is my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased. Matthew 3:17

"Here is My servant, whom I have chosen, My beloved, in whom My soul delights. I will put My Spirit on Him, and He will proclaim justice to the nations" Matthew 12:18

For He received honour and glory from God the Father when the voice from the Majestic Glory said to Him, "This is My beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased" 2

Peter 1:17



Anand, now the logical question is: if there is only one person, who acted as three, then could he have said the above to HIMSELF? Or could one person have said to himself that "Father, into THY hands I commit my soul"? Please note that on some occasions the Father spoke audibly from heaven when the Lord was on the earth?

I had not examined those verses from that angle. Now that you ask, a logical deduction is that TWO separate people are needed to make the above statements.

"Into THY hands I commit my soul" makes sense only if Jesus and Father are different. So it is clear to me now that one God three manifestations cannot be true.





But Dr. S, isn't the 'plurality in Godhead' concept introduced by the New Testament writers? After all, we do not read of it anywhere in the Old Testament.




Anil, I almost expected that question from one of you.

Let us look again into Scripture-based data to decide if you are right.





What about the plurality there? The use of 'us'?



Rulers often use the word "we" and "us" to talk about themselves. So God the ruler of Universe could have used that word in the same way and it would not indicate plurality of Godhead.



Ok, then what do you say about the expression in Genesis 3:22, the first part?

What does it say?



It says: "And the LORD God said, Behold, the man is become as one of us, to know good and evil" Genesis 3:22a



What do you say about the expression "one of us"?

Can a single person use this expression about himself?



Dr S, I had not noticed this verse earlier. The expression "one of us" can be used only when there is a plurality of persons!



Then what about your claim that plurality of Godhead was introduced by the New Testament writers?

I now realize that the concept of trinity is there in the Bible right from the first book onward!




But Dr. S, why all this obsession with Trinity. Can't we just ignore this doctrine, seeing many people don't like it? That will make everyone very happy!



So, you feel "give no offense to anyone" is a good strategy in doctrinal matters

Looks promising, isn't it? Let us examine this approach objectively!

Are there any who dislike justification by faith?



I gather that plenty of Christians dislike the doctrine of justification by faith.

Ok, what about the doctrine that Bible alone is the word of God and that Bible alone is the final authority in matters of doctrine and practice.



I know a LOT of Christians who simply hate this Bible-alone doctrine!



Anand, you say we should not offend anyone. So, we need to abandon all doctrines that offend people. So here are the last four doctrines that you said many people dislike:



- Justification by faith alone
- Salvation by grace alone
- Christ as the only Saviour
- Bible as the only revelation

So, WHAT do you say we should do with the above doctrines?

I say, let us abandon ALL such doctrines that make people unhappy or upset. This will make Christianity a happy faith!



That is a small cost

In other words, destroy the Christian faith for that is a small cost to maintain mutual harmony with people who are unhappy with doctrine!



Oh no!! I would NEVER take that stand Dr. S!

I would NOT want to take lead in destroying our precious Christian faith!

But that is exactly what you have done when you say we should stop talking about faith alone, grace alone,

Christ alone and Bible alone.



This approach is called 'burning a mansion for the sake of killing a rat'. For the sake of some unhappy people, you are advocating that the fundamental pillars of the Christian faith be destroyed. Do you really mean to do it Anand?
